DYKE GARDENERS August

Water and feed regularly

- Continue to feed tomato plants with tomato food and remove lower leaves to help with air circulation and prevent disease
- Pinch out the top of tomato plants to concentrate the growth into the fruit that has already formed. Aim to leave 5 or 6 trusses of fruit per plant

Deadhead and prune

- Dead-head annual bedding plants and perennials to encourage them to flower into the autumn and stop them self-seeding
- Prune wisteria after flowering by removing all the whippy side-shoots from the main branch framework to about 20cm from their base
- Trim any lavender plants after they've finished flowering
- Prune climbing roses and rambling roses once they've finished flowering (unless they're repeat-flowerers in which case leave them)
- Cut back leaves on grapevines to let the sun ripen the fruits
- Check your fruit trees for brown rot and quickly remove any affected fruit to help stop it spreading
- Cut back Alchemilla and hardy geraniums and penstemon to encourage more growth

Save seed and propagate new plants

- Take leaf cuttings from succulents, such as echeverias, crassula and sedums
- Take cuttings of pelargoniums, fuchsia and rosemary to propagate them for next year
- Plant out any rooted runners of strawberries for a good crop next year

Harvest

 Start harvesting your main crop potatoes and onions, shallots and garlic as the leaves yellow and die back

Plant

- Plant autumn bulbs, such as colchicums, sternbergia and nerines
- Plant out your leeks and brassicas if you haven't already, and you can also squeeze in a final sowing of spinach, beetroot and chard in the first couple of weeks of August
- Sow salad leaves under cover, or out in the open if in warmer parts of the UK
- Look out for seed potatoes to give you new potatoes at Christmas.

Pumpkins, monsters, witches, zombies, skeletons, ghosts - all are welcome at the Dyke Spooky Scarecrow event this October.



On Thursday 21st July Dyke WI hosted Second Helpings Stamford whose manifesto is to 'Feed Bellies not bins'. The project aims to reduce food waste by using food gifted from local sources that would otherwise go to landfill by working with supermarkets and local suppliers to distribute surplus food. The Saturday lunchtime café is based on Barn Hill and offers a 3 course meal on a Pay-As-You-Feel basis – your choice is to donate whatever value you feel your food is worth and this can be in the form of money or time. There is also a community fridge and bunker offering core products such as bread, potatoes, vegetables and fruit. It was an interesting and informative presentation.
