Dyke gardeners

November / December

- Plant spring bulbs including tulips now
- Cut back roses to reduce wind rock
- Sow sweet peas for flowers next year
- Lift dahlia tubers to dry out under cover
- Cut back perennials
- Plant onion, shallot, and garlic sets
- Prune apple and pear trees anytime between now and February.
 (Don't prune stone fruit such as plum trees now as they will be susceptible to the silver leaf fungus wait until midsummer)
- Plant bare root shrubs
- Sow hardy broad beans and peas such as 'Aquadulce Claudia' and Meteor outdoors in rows for extra early harvests in spring
- Plant asparagus crowns
- Peruse the seed catalogues and order for next year
