DVHMC Chairman's Report

It has been a busy time since the last newsletter with some great community events that have raised significant funds for the Hall and its maintenance.

There are three items of maintenance for the Hall still to complete and fund this year:

Shed Replacement

The old shed has been removed and the contents stored at William Ash's farm (Thank you William, Antoinette and Mike!). A new steel shed has now been ordered and we are hopeful for delivery and erection by September this year. Gill and Pete nominated the Village Hall as their charity to support at their Party in the Paddock in June and they collected an amazing £230 on the night that has since grown to £380 with other donations. In addition, it was requested that we set up a Just Giving site for those who prefer to give that way - please see link below:

At the time of going to press, this has raised an additional £60 bringing our grand total for Party in the Paddock to £440. Fantastic!

The Hall Committee are very grateful to Gill and Pete for supporting us this way – Thank You!

The other fundraising events run by the Village Hall Events Team so far this year including the 70's and 80's Themed Quiz, the Plant Sale and Trash and Treasure, have contributed a further £1026. Brilliant! We are well on our way to paying a significant chunk of the shed replacement cost.

Thanks to all of you who organised, supported and attended these events.

Hall Kitchen/Extension

The extension of the main part of the Hall used as the kitchen is in serious need of external repair. The wooden cladding and some of the framework is rotten and we need to fully re-clad that part of the building. We are currently getting quotes for the work and hoping for a grant to carry out the work this year before the winter.

Chair Replacement

We would like to replace a good number of the hard and uncomfortable plastic chairs that we have with some padded and altogether more comfortable items. Chairs have been identified and we are similarly hopeful of a grant to support 50-60 replacement chairs. Our bottoms deserve some comfort! Watch this space for updates.

Upcoming events

We have a couple of very interesting talks coming up in October and November.

Local historian Brian Lawrance will give a presentation on the history of Dyke and Cawthorpe and Dyke resident Phil Peplow will be telling us fascinating facts about the Zulu War, debunking some of the myths around the film - did they really sing Men of Harlech?

Both men are passionate about their subjects and have some fascinating artifacts to show us. These events will feature a licensed bar and will both be open to the wider Bourne and Morton communities and are sure to be well attended so please make sure you purchase your tickets early to avoid disappointment.

Please do keep supporting the events that are put on for the benefit of the village. It really does help maintain the hall for the benefit of your community.

Things to do in the garden September/October

Keep watering containers and deadheading

Save money by collecting seeds and consider drying seedheads to use in winter displays in the house

Collect flower heads to press and make cards or pictures for gifts

Take tender perennial cuttings from salvias and pelargoniums for next year

Finish sowing salad leaves and hardy lettuce for autumn/winter and early spring pickings

Towards the end of September start planting bulbs for next Spring - narcissi (daffs), hyacinths, anenomes, crocus and mini iris - *I always plant some in small pots to have on a table outside so you can appreciate them and having them inside on a cold, grey day always makes me smile*

Refresh your containers if they are looking tired with winter bedding and spring bulbs. *Lately I have been putting small evergreen plants in to give a longer season so I put grasses in with violas and bulbs*

Make a bulb lasagne to extend your display - the largest and latest flowering bulbs go in the deepest, moving to the smallest and earliest in the top layer - *e.g. tulips at the bottom, narcissi next and crocus or irises at the top of the container*

Start collecting leaves to make your own leaf mould - put them in a black bin liner with holes, tie when full and leave to rot down

Containers will still need watering but keep the compost moist rather than really wet

Lift tender plants and bulbs and store inside and protect tender plants

Something a bit lovely to have in your garden for Sept/Oct is Cyclamen hederifolium - autumn flowering hardy lants whose flowers open before the leaves appear which are beautiful themselves - these last all winter

Best not to plant tulips until Nov/Dec time.
