DEFIBRILLATOR AND

FIRST AID TRAINING

Monday 27th January from 7pm

A life saving defibrillator and CPR training course in Dyke Village Hall.

Stephen, from St John's Ambulance, will deliver a 90-minute training session on the care of the unconscious person, the delivery of effective CPR and the use of a community defibrillator.

This training course will help you to save a life through early recognition of Cardiac arrest, the commencement of effective CPR and early defibrillation using a community defibrillator.

It is important to remember that in adults effective CPR and defibrillation within 5 minutes of cardiac arrest can increase survival by up to 70%.

Anyone aged 13 years or over is welcome to sign up for the training session.

If called upon, could you save a life? Sign-up for this course to find out how you could.


