## Warm Hub in Dyke Village Hall

Dyke Village Hall has become a real haven again on Tuesday mornings for villagers and friends. It is not only a warm space to be together with rising fuel prices it also helps to reunite villagers who have felt isolated during and since the Covid Pandemic.

We communicate through the village Whatsapp Chat and through the Village newsletter. Sometimes we produce a flier with updated events and information.

Anna McIvor switches on the ancient central heating boiler in readiness and Les Panrucker and Robin Woodward erect the tables and chairs. We push the tables together to ensure no one feels left out.

From an old suitcase in the corner, we retrieve playing cards and dominos. They are in use every week! From the kitchen, coffee and tea and freshly baked cakes are on offer.

Some people who work from home pop in to take a break and one or two members of Dyke WI join us and help with baking from time to time.

This winter we began the warm hubs Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> October 2024.

One week Cllr. Sue Woolley invited three Highways Officers to listen to us and to share issues concerning flooding in the village following heavy rainfall.

## **RECENT EVENTS AT THE HALL**

A **DEFIBRILLATOR AND FIRST AID TRAINING** course was delivered at the hall on Monday 27th January led by Stephen and his team from St John's Ambulance. The 90-minute training session covered the care of the unconscious person, the delivery of effective CPR and the use of a community defibrillator.

It is important to remember that in adults effective CPR and defibrillation within 5 minutes of cardiac arrest can increase survival by up to 70%.

This event was attended by 25 people from the Dyke village and surrounding villages.

Our thanks go to Stephen and team for their informative workshop and to Viv Chadwick for organising this event. Donations from the attendees made £100 for The St John's Ambulance Fund.

## **General Village News** Message from Councillor Les Panrucker

A Message from Councillor Les Panrucker

We had a very constructive meeting at the village hall on the 11/02/2025 with ClIr Sue Woolley and 3 senior LCC highways management personnel to apologise on the time taken to rectify the flooding in Dyke on the main road near the pub. We were told after lengthy investigations a solution had been made to direct the water into a new underground catch point and work would start on the 28/4/2025 involving a road closure, if the area flooded again before the works started a tanker would be sent to pump away the water! Some 40 people attended the meeting from the village to ask questions on the morning which lasted about an hour. The meeting concluded as stated above and as a village we felt reassured from what information had been given and looked forward to the completion in April and a thank you to Sue for setting this up.

On the playing field front most of you should have seen the appearance of the Goal posts and in March we will see an all weather Table Tennis Table installed and later in the month 7 pieces of Outdoor Fitness Equipment will be put in place thanks to SKDC funding. I will keep you updated on the rewilding project moving forward in the Spring.

Lastly as some of you will know, the Village hall has been decorated inside and the layout changed to increase space this has given the hall a new feel and new chairs have been purchased. I would like to thank everyone involved in this project and in making such a wonderful difference to the Hall.
