DVHMC Chair Report—Dec 2025

Hello all, and welcome to the Winter 2025 edition of the Newsletter.

We are approaching Christmas now and not one but two Christmas events to come Christmas Fun at the Hall and the last Warm Hub of the year. Carols and games plus nibbles and mulled wine will be on offer – come along if you can as it's sure to be a good laugh. It certainly was last year!

You will probably have noticed that we have had solar PV panels mounted on the south-facing roof of the Village Hall in the last few months. This was part of a large project to replace the ageing heating system and add a solar and battery system to keep our running costs down, improve our carbon footprint and the Hall environment at the same time. There is an article in this newsletter that gives some details if you are interested.

Sincere thanks should go to the **UK Shared Prosperity Fund**, administered by **South Kesteven District Council**, **Bourne United Charities**, **The Len Pick Trust**, and **Bourne Town Council**, all of whom significantly contributed to financing the project.

The most recent event was a Race Night that was held on the 15th of November – great to see old and new faces there who had a really good time. That event raised more than £1000 too so really helpful in supporting co-funding of the heating project. In September, we had the Scarecrow Competition and Craft Fair which was another excellent community event raising over £900. **Thank you** to all who attended, supported or helped out at those events.

An update in terms of the Village Hall Committee itself, Jenny and I have decided (really this time!) to stand down from the Committee from the date of the next Annual General Meeting in April 2026 to allow time to carry out more travel and meet other commitments. As such it's a great opportunity for new people to join the Committee, and help steer improvements, put on events and generally keep our village as an enjoyable place to live, with a wonderful community. DVH Solar, Battery and Heating Project

For a number of years, the Village Hall Committee has recognised that the heating system (a blown air, gas fueled system) was in need of replacement. We have suffered a number of breakdowns and parts were becoming harder to find.

An opportunity presented itself in the form of the UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF), a central government sponsored program, investing in communities and, in our case, reducing the carbon footprint of community buildings and improving their sustainability. As this was focused on larger projects a plan was developed by a small sub-committee to combine the heating replacement with a state-of-the-art solar and battery system that would help to power it using significantly less electricity, and no natural gas.

It was projected to save in the region of 2.5 tonnes of CO2 per year and reduce our dependence on the electricity grid by up to 60%. This should equate to reducing our energy bills by up to half.

The funding application was successful, with the main part being funded by the **UKSPF** (administered by **SKDC**), but with significant additional funding from **Bourne United Charities**, **The Len Pick Trust**, and **Bourne Town Council**. A big thank you to all of them.

Suppliers were selected from the local area – **TCL Solar** based in Lincoln provided and the solar and battery system and did a great job on the installation. The heating system was specified by **Heissen Heating** in Boston using super-efficient infrared space and panel heaters and expertly installed by **JC Electrical** based here in Dyke.

In brief, the specification of the solar and battery system is as follows:

15 x 500 Watt panels, total reference generation capability of 7.5 kW, manufactured by Eurener in Spain

17 kWhrs (5 x 3.4 kW modules) of battery storage capacity and associated inverter, manufactured by GivEnergy in the UK

Please feel free to take a look at the installation in the store cupboard at the Hall – you can see from the green battery lights what the state of charge of the system is.

It's very early days to judge whether we will meet our target CO2 reduction but, with the mild weather we have been having, we have used very little grid electricity since the installation in October, so early signs are good.

With regard to the heating system, we have set a minimum temperature for the Hall of 10 deg C to ensure that it does not take too long to heat up from cold — even so time needs to be allowed to reach the target temperature, the trade off being that the Hall will remain at a stable temperature with no intervention after that.

For regular hall users, there is an app that can be used to control the heating so pre-heat can be easily done without opening the Hall.

Please remember to switch off the heating either using the control tablet located in the kitchen, or by going to each controller. There are some instructions posted up in the Hall to help you.

Scarecrow Competition—There was a great turnout of both scarecrows and visitors to this year's event. The winning entry, judged by Councillor Les Panrucker, was created by Linda Warren who generously donated half of her winnings back to the Village Hall—thank you Linda.

Race Night—A great time was had by all who attended and it was lovely to see many new faces. There was a lot of competition with both winners and losers but the last horse to gallop to victory was owned by a team including the Peplows and the Anthonys who won the coveted annual trophy.
